For us in Nigeria, the Nigeria Export Process Zones Authority (NEPZA) has continually leveraged on new AEZO's findings and strategies over the years to expand the frontiers of the country's zone operations.

The development of Special Economic Zones (SEZ's) in Nigeria under the direct supervision of President Muhammadu Buhari is a presidential priority intervention aimed at attracting substantial foreign and domestic investments to develop global

standard facilities dedicated to export-oriented manufacturing in a range of industries across Nigeria. SEZ's are therefore seen as a tool for accelerating Nigeria's industrialization programme through the creation of jobs and promotion of exports.

The SEZ scheme in Nigeria is continually being revamped and repositioned in order to put the required infrastructure in place to ensure these zones become business tools that speed up Nigeria's industrialization.
