Update on AfCFTA

- 54 countries have signed; 37 countries have submitted instruments of ratification;
- 86% of Rules of Origin have been concluded; Amongst the outstanding areas are: edible oils, automotive industry, textiles
- Work on tariff offers, which are based on 90% tariff lines still ongoing
- Required trading documents have been identified, and are known
- Offers on Services on going
- Negotiations on Phase II issues are underway
- Capacity building/awareness exercises areunderway
- National Implementation strategies are being established





Benefits to SEZ

These are recognized in the AfCFTA Agreement; Art 23 of the Protocol on Trade in Goods states:

Special Economic Arrangements/Zones

- 1. State Parties may support the establishment and operation of special economic arrangements or zones for the purpose of accelerating development.
- 2. Products benefiting from special economic arrangements or zones shall be subject to any regulations that shall be developed by the Council of Ministers. Regulations under this paragraph shall be *in support of the continental industrialisation programmes.*
- 3. The trade of products manufactured in special economic arrangements or zones within the AfCFTA shall be subject to the provisions of Annex 2 on Rules of Origin.
