The signing ceremony for the establishment of the Global Alliance on Special Economic Zones (GASEZ) took place on the first day of the annual conference of the world Free Zones Organization AICE 2022 in Jamaica.

The GASEZ seeks to pool the resources, experience, and commitment of the United Nations and global, regional, and national organizations to support SEZs in contributing to resilient, inclusive development. Joining the initiative for the future establishment of a global alliance were: the World Free Zones Organization (WFZO), the World Free and Special Economic Zones Federation (FEMOZA); the Africa Economic Zones Organization (AEZO); the Free Trade Zones Association of the Americas (AFZA); the International Association of Science Parks (IASP); the National Association of Foreign-Trade Zones (NAFTZ) from the United States; the Association of Clusters, Technology Parks and SEZs of Russia; and the Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA).

A model for successful economic zones

The Covid-19 has had a significant impact on special economic zones, resulting in a shift in attitudes toward incentives. The question here is how they will thrive in the future. Dr Douglas Van Den Berghe provides an answer in the form of a model he developed.

The model depicts the "sweet spot" where future zones should ideally be positioned and operated. It is at the crossroads of three dimensions: the UN Sustainable Development Goals, high-quality infrastructure and services, and maximizing economic development impact.
